1976 joshua lives with his mother in the maid s room in the backyard of their
wealthy white employers house in the city by the sea he doesn t quite
understand the events going on around him but when he rescues a stranger
and riots begin to sweep the country joshua has to face the world beneath the
world deep inside him to make heartbreaking choices that will change his life
forever genuine and quietly unflinching this beautifully nuanced novel from a
veteran journalist captures a child s eye view of the struggle that shaped a
nation and riveted the world

from an internationally renowned marine biologist comes a colorful
underwater journey into the homes of hundreds of unknown sea creatures
featuring his mesmerizing words and award winning photography

this prize winning debut novel from the author of like a house on fire is
reminiscent of hornby well observed and thoughtfully funny minneapolis star
tribune fifteen years after their breakup rich and sandy have both settled into
the unfulfilling compromises of middle age he s a late night infomercial editor

with photojournalism aspirations she makes hippie jewelry for a local market and struggles to maintain a new age lifestyle that fails to provide the answers she seeks to distract themselves from their inadequacies rich and sandy cling to the shining moment of their youth when they met as environmental activists as part of a world famous blockade to save tasmania s franklin river their daughter sophie has always remained skeptical of this ecological fairytale but when rich invites her on a backpacking trip through tasmania for her fifteenth birthday sophie sees it as a way to bond with a father she s never known as they progress further into the wilderness the spell of rich s worldly charm soon gives way to suspicion and fear as his overconfidence sets off a chain of events that no one could have predicted kennedy evokes a more lyrical version of jodi picoult hitting the reader with raw heartbreaking sometimes hilarious prose library journal in elegant fluidly written prose kennedy not only delivers scathing portraits of the ineffectual adults and the times that shaped them but also makes the epic wilderness another vividly rendered character in the story booklist starred review kennedy writes like an antipodean anne tyler wryly aware of the heart s internal contradictions yet slow to judge financial times

the earth beneath my feet is the first of two books that describe an epic 7 000 mile wilderness walk across an entire continent like millions of people andrew terrill grew up on the edge of a big city but for terrill suburban life felt predictable and crowded the days lacked purpose and meaning what he craved was a life of freedom adventure and simplicity and after nearly dying in the swiss alps that was the life he chose in may 1997 he left his london home and travelled to the southernmost point of calabria italy once there he turned north and began walking headed for norway s north cape leaving civilisation behind terrill journeyed deep into the other europe the hidden wilderness europe that still exists beyond road s end hiking from the apennine mountain range a wild side of italy few outsiders ever know to the vast northern wildernesses of arctic norway terrill immersed himself in the natural world forever seeking a deeper connection with it the 18 month journey became a voyage of discovery unveiling the secrets and treasures of europe s least known places the miles brought hardships and struggles pushed terrill to his limits but ultimately led to unimaginable rewards the earth beneath my feet covers the journey s first eight months taking readers the entire length of italy during a searing hot summer and across austria into the depths of an alpine

winter it is a compelling tale of adventure told with freshness optimism wonder and youthful enthusiasm an inspiring true story of a young man who chose to embrace life and live it to the full

one of the world's oldest legends tells of a vast network of underground tunnels and passageways linking the continents to a subterranean kingdom this utopia is said to be inhabited by an ancient race of people who have lived in seclusion for centuries hidden from the sight of mankind but aware of everything

waiting for the end examines two dozen contemporary novels within the
context of a half century of theorizing about the function of ending in narrative
that theorizing about ending generated a powerful dynamic a quarter century
ago with the advent of feminist criticism of masculinist readings of the role
played by ending in fiction feminists such as theresa de lauretis in 1984 and
more famously susan winnett in her 1991 pmla essay coming unstrung were
leading voices in a swelling chorus of theorist pointing out the masculinist bias
of ending in narrative with the entry of feminist readings of ending it became
inevitable that criticism of fiction would become gendered through the

recognition of difference transcending a simple binary of female male to establish a spectrum of masculine to feminine endings regardless of the sex of the writer accordingly waiting for the end examines pairs of novels one pair by margaret atwood and one by ian mcewan to demonstrate how a writer can offer endings at either end of the gender spectrum

dennis tedlock presents startling new methods for transcribing translating and interpreting oral performance that carry wide implications for all areas of the spoken arts moreover he reveals how the categories and concepts of poetics and hermeneutics based in western literary traditions cannot be carried over in their entirety to the spoken arts of other cultures but require extensive reevaluation
