one of the most delightful natural history studies in decades the boston globe eye of the albatross takes us soaring to locales where whales sea turtles penguins and shearwaters flourish in their own quotidian rhythms carl safina s guide and inspiration is an albatross he calls amelia whose life and far flung flights he describes in fascinating detail interwoven with recollections of whalers and famous explorers eye of the albatross probes the unmistakable environmental impact of the encounters between man and marine life safina s perceptive and authoritative portrait results in a transforming ride to the ends of the earth for the reader as well as an eye opening look at the health of our oceans

looks at what is known about the albatross a bird of legend and poetry and examines the

conditions that are threatening over three quarters of all albatross species with extinction

1961 he has described in flowing prose all the beautiful ports of call the camaraderie of the crew and of course the tension and problems that are inevitable with such an undertaking as you turn the pages of white squall you will become one of the crew aboard this great ship as she visits the then unspoiled lands and people of those far off ports you will understand why people would want to accomplish such a difficult undertaking and all the joys and hardships of life aboard when you have finished this truly great sea adventure you will feel you were there on that final fatal voyage

children of the albatross is considered by critics to be one of anaïs nin s most beautifully written books it is also a groundbreaker in that it eloquently addresses androgyny and homosexuality which few literary works dared to do in 1940s america we are introduced to three of nin s most significant characters djuna lillian and sabina all of whom represent different aspects of nin s character serenity earthiness and the femme fatale respectively in the first part of the novel the sealed room we witness djuna s developing perception of sexuality as we follow her from when as an adolescent she has learned to fear powerful masculine potent men to her search for love in young sexually ambivalent men the transparent children finally fusing with an airy teenage boy to whom she introduces the world of love and sexuality in the second part the café nin reveals the psychological truth of her relationship with her lover and mentor henry miller via her main characters interactions with the powerful omnipotent jay whom nin fashioned after miller children of the albatross offers the reader anaïs nin s sense of inner reality perhaps more beautifully and effectively than in any other work

for twenty years john aitchison has been travelling the world to film wildlife for the bbc and other broadcasters taking him to far away places on every continent the shark and the albatross is the story of these journeys of discovery of his encounters with animals and occasional enterprising individuals in remote and sometimes dangerous places his destinations include the far north and the far south expeditions to film for frozen planet and other natural history series in svalbard alaska the remote atlantic island of south georgia and the antarctic they also encompass wild places in india china and the united states in all he finds and describes key moments in the lives of animals among them polar bears and penguins seals and whales sharks and birds and wolves and lynxes he reveals what happens behind the scenes and beyond the camera he explains the practicalities and challenges of the filming process and the problems of survival in perilous places he records touching moments and dramatic incidents some ending in success others desperately sad there are times when a hunted animal triumphs against the odds and others when in spite of preparation for every outcome disaster strikes and as the author shows in several incidents that combine nail biting tension with hair raising hilarity disaster can strike for film makers too this is natural history writing at its absolute best evocative informative and gripping from first to last

scientifically accurate this story of the laysan albatross is told from the point of view of the young bird as he begins life and as he matures to adulthood a unique and little known bird the laysan spends most of its life at sea roaming tens of thousands of miles of ocean the adults whose life span is as much as thirty years return to land each winter to reproduce and raise their young after its initial departure from midway at about five months of age the young bird does not return to breed for seven or eight years mildred l fisher the wife of harvey i fisher a noted zoologist who has conducted extensive research on the albatross at the invitation of the office of naval research has accompanied her husband on many trips to midway and has served as his research assistant from her experience she has developed a respect and

affection for the goonies which she feels is outside the scope of scientific data it is her desire here to present to all readers interested in natural history a personable view of this interesting and unusual bird the result is a story of the laysan albatross told with imagination and feeling illustrated with over sixty black and white photographs

the laysan albatross is called ml in hawaiian

a biography of the original of coleridge s ancient mariner a sailor by the name of simon hatley in 1719 simon hatley a sailor on the speedwell rounding cape horn shot an albatross in a melancholy fit and his scheming captain george shelvocke wrote about the incident samuel taylor coleridge read shelvocke s book seventy eight years later and was inspired to write his famous poem the rime of the ancyent marinere robert fowke working from contemporary documents uncovers for the first time in over two hundred years the true identity of simon hatley the ancient mariner and gives an enthralling account of his adventures simon hatley sailed to the pacific on two of the most dangerous privateering voyages of the early eighteenth century was implicated in an act of piracy twice imprisoned by the inquisition and in 1709 sailed on the same ship with alexander selkirk the model for robinson crusoe and william dampier mentioned in gulliver s travels as my cousin dampier the models for the ancient mariner robinson crusoe and to some extent gulliver were once all shipmates together the tale of hatley s adventures illuminates events behind this strange literary coincidence contents preface hatley the discovery of simon hatley the ancient mariner s identity his childhood and family background the language of the sea about the extraordinary voyages and books of buccaneer authors and shipmates of simon hatley such as william dampier how they exploited their credentials as seamen for literary and commercial gain the hand of the most high how religious tension was reflected on the high sea and the broader politcal religious context behind early eighteenth century pirate buccaneering and privateering voyages into the pacific the voyage of the cinque ports william dampier s privateering expedition into the pacific at the start of the war of the spanish succession when alexander selkirk robinson crusoe was marooned on the juan fernandez islands the voyage of the duke and duchess hatley sails as third mate the rescue of selkirk capture of guaykil hatley lost at sea good dogs were tories return of the duke and duchess formation of the south sea company litigation and dissension hatley lost at sea lima and the ancient mariner tortured by the inquisition gentlelam venturers the voyage of the speedwell the albatross the shooting of the albatross and other adventures crusoe and gulliver the south sea bubble bursts robinson crusoe gulliver and shelvocke s book are written last information on simon hatley coleridge the genesis of the poem bibliography endnotes index

the albatross was the premier fixed wing rescue aircraft for the u s air force and coast guard its very colorful history begins in 1946 and spans nearly a quarter of a century including service with twenty two foreign nations with a total of 466 built by grumman more than eighty examples still thrive on the civil register the albatross also saw extensive service in the korean and vietnam wars the fascinating history of this unique aircraft is complemented by over 200 photographs including many in color showing the great variations in color schemes and markings
