this volume contains the excavation report for 12 cremation burials from the phrygian site  
 of gordion in central anatolia these tombs dating from the later seventh century to the  
 third quarter of the 6th century bce were excavated by the university museum between  
 1950 and 1969 and by the german brothers alfred and gustav korte in 1900 the processes  
 for interment through construction of tumulus and cremation procedure are carefully  
 detailed followed by an analysis of associated finds two tumuli of the hellenistic period  
 both covering stone chambers with inhumation burials within are included in an appendix  
 further appendices discuss other specific materials excavated from the cremation burials  
 a discussion of the contemporary inhumation and cremation tumulus burials at gordion in  
 the phrygian period highlighting their continuities and significant differences forms part of  
 the conclusion as does discussion of sociocultural developments at gordion between ca  
 650 525 bce as illuminated by the mortuary remains the tumuli afford insights into  
 questions related to gender religion adult child identity trade social status ethnicity  
 transcultural affiliations ceramic developments jewelry manufacture high status artifact

display including ivory feasting behaviors animal sacrifice hero cult and widespread killing of artifacts associated with the cremation burials this entirely new publication of gordion s tumuli makes available at last the elite cremation burials of the later middle and early late phrygian achaemenid periods excavated by the university museum by including the two korte tumuli it provides a complete assemblage of the cremation tumuli at gordion they afford remarkable new insights into life death and an elaborate system of value at gordion during this most turbulent century

how do regions form and evolve what are the human and geographical factors which help to unify a region and what are the political considerations which limit integration and curtail co operation between a region s communities through a diverse series of case studies focusing on the regional history of lesbos and the troad from the seventh century bc down to the first century ad the kingdom of priam offers a detailed exploration of questions about regional integration in the ancient world drawing on a wide range of evidence from the geography of strabo and the botany of theophrastos to the accounts of eighteenth and nineteenth century travellers and the epigraphy numismatics and archaeology of the region these case studies analyse the politics of processes of regional integration in the troad and examine the insular identity of lesbos the extent to which the island was integrated into the mainland and the consequences of this relationship for its internal dynamic throughout it is argued that although lesbos and the troad became ever more economically well integrated over the course of this period they nevertheless remained politically fragmented and were only capable of unified action at moments of severe crisis these regional dynamics intersected in complex and often unexpected ways with the various imperial systems persian athenian macedonian attalid roman which ruled over the region and shaped its internal dynamics both through direct interventions in regional politics and through the pressures and incentives which these imperial systems created for local communities

quandaries arising from new biomedical technologies but also long standing presumptions about who we really are and what we can pass on to future generations

nils eikermann describes the framework conditions for the application of value based performance measures and critically analyses selected ones the disclosure of value based performance indicators is important in order to demonstrate the successful management of a company and to satisfy the increasing information needs of investors however companies adapt the developed theoretical concepts of value based performance measures to their practical needs and thus investors are no longer able to compare the performance of companies in addition there is a variety of different metrics from which companies can choose the empirical study aims to reduce existing research gaps and is divided into three parts the analysis of annual reports of selected european companies the calculation of a standardised value based performance measure and a value relevance study in the form of an association study

participation and the post museum discusses the concept of participation in museum practice as well as ideas that constitute the paradigm of the post museum based on extensive empirical research conducted in thirty diverse polish museums and drawing upon her own museum practice the author considers whether museums are democratising or whether this is an illusion that obscures the reinforcement of the authoritarian position that is historically inherent to museums referring to different areas of museum practice the author analyses not only how and why but mostly if museums are capable and willing to share their power with the public and how it affects their identity drawing on literature from the fields of political and social sciences as well as cultural and museum studies on participation and applicability of the term in museums it becomes apparent that using participatory tools even when they empower the public to co author collaborate and take co responsibility does not necessarily lead to participatory museums participation and the post museum argues that museums rooted in the modernist tradition are usually not ready to share power and responsibility with non experts from outside the museum world it will be of interest to academics and students of museum studies museum professionals culture management and heritage studies around the world

## Calculating Discrete Expected Value

The discrete expected value (often denoted as  $E(X)$  or  $\mu$ ) is calculated by summing the product of each possible outcome and its corresponding probability. Formally, if  $X$  is a discrete random variable with possible outcomes  $x_1, x_2, x_3, \dots, x_n$  and corresponding probabilities  $P(X=x_1), P(X=x_2), P(X=x_3), \dots, P(X=x_n)$ , then the expected value is:  $E(X) = x_1P(X=x_1) + x_2P(X=x_2) + x_3P(X=x_3) + \dots + x_nP(X=x_n)$ . This formula essentially weighs each outcome by its likelihood of occurrence. Outcomes with higher probabilities contribute more significantly to the expected value.

## Example: A Simple Dice Roll

Let's consider the example of rolling a fair six-sided die. The possible outcomes ( $X$ ) are {1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6}, and each outcome has a probability of  $1/6$ . The expected value is:  $E(X) = (1)(1/6) + (2)(1/6) + (3)(1/6) + (4)(1/6) + (5)(1/6) + (6)(1/6) = 3.5$ . This means that if you were to roll the die many times, the average value of the rolls would approach 3.5. Note that 3.5 is not a possible outcome of a single roll; the expected value represents a long-run average.

## Example: A Lottery Ticket

Imagine a lottery ticket costs \$5, and the prize is \$1000 with a probability of  $1/1000$  and nothing with a probability of  $999/1000$ . Let  $X$  be the net profit from buying the ticket. The possible outcomes are:  $X = \$995$  (winning) with probability  $1/1000$ ,  $X = -\$5$  (losing) with probability  $999/1000$ . The expected value is:  $E(X) = (\$995)(1/1000) + (-\$5)(999/1000) = -\$4$ . This means on average, you would lose \$4 per ticket if you bought many tickets.

## Properties of Expected Value

Expected value has several useful properties: Linearity:  $E(aX + b) = aE(X) + b$ , where 'a' and 'b' are constants. This means that the expected value of a linear transformation of a random variable is simply the transformed expected value. Additivity:  $E(X + Y) = E(X) + E(Y)$ , where  $X$  and  $Y$  are random variables. The expected value of the sum of two random variables is the sum of their individual expected values. This holds true even if  $X$  and  $Y$  are not independent.
